Greetings to all SOMA Missioners,

Please allow me to start by introducing myself, as many may not know who I am, or where I'm from. My name is Melinda McMahon and I am the Rector of the Anglican parish of Southlakes which is located in the Lake Macquarie district of

But, most of all, I am passionate about fulfilling God's mission in the power of the Spirit. Shortly after returning home from participating in my first SOMA mission to Northern Ireland, I was delighted to be invited to be the new National Director.

I would like to start our newsletters with a devotional, keeping our focus on the great commission which our Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ called us to fulfil.

In our parish, during the season of Pentecost, we have been following a devotional which journeys through the book of Acts, teaching us how to minister in the power of the Holy Spirit. I'd like to share the devotional of Day 14, entitled, "The Spirit of Pentecost is the Spirit of Mission". When Jesus promised His disciples the power they needed to accomplish the work He had given them. He said, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). There are at least five wavs the Spirit empowers us to fulfill God's mission.

The Spirit Compels Us to Witness | With the baptism in the Holy Spirit comes an inner compulsion to tell others about Jesus and His salvation. When Peter and John were ordered to stop preaching and teaching in Jesus' Meeting scheduled Thursday, 28<sup>th</sup> September, at 7pm

name, they replied, "We cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20). The Holy Spirit was in them compelling them to talk about their Lord. In the same way, the Spirit compels us to tell others about Jesus.

**The Spirit Enables Us to Speak** | Once the disciples were filled with the Spirit, they spoke with unexpected ability. The people were astonished that these ordinary men spoke with such authority. We can have that same "great grace" upon our lives if we will be empowered by the Holy Spirit as they were.

The Spirit Equips Us to Defeat Demons | Paul wrote, "The god of this age [Satan] has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ" (2 Cor. 4:4). Jesus overcame demons in the Spirit's power, and so must we. This is another reason we must be filled with—and remain full of—the Holy Spirit.

The Spirit Empowers Us to Work Miracles | In Acts, signs and wonders were a key element in advancing the gospel. Following the Spirit's outpouring at Pentecost, "awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles" (2:43). The same can be true today. If we will be filled with the Spirit and remain committed to God's mission, the Spirit will work through us to perform miracles to the glory of God.

**The Spirit Gives Us Boldness** | The Spirit who empowers us for mission is who gives us courage to witness for Christ in the face of danger and threats. We know that Stephen was stoned, James was beheaded, Peter was imprisoned, and Paul was once stoned and left for dead. When we face hostility and threat today, we must be like those first Christians. We must be filled with the Spirit and continue to boldly proclaim the message of salvation.

You and I are called to fulfill Jesus' mission. So let us 'Go in love and serve the Lord, in the power of the Spirit' wherever the Lord has placed us, wherever our missionfield is.

Most of the alternations revolve around changes to the membership requirements, the role of the Episcopal Visitor, our new relationship with the Diocese of Bendigo, and our relationship with the SOMA International forum.

# New hospitality tormed the Diocese of Bendigo

We are happy to announce that new arrangements have been made with the Diocese of Bendigo for SOMA's insurance needs to be managed by them. While this does relieve us of much of the administrative management of our safe ministry training requirements, it means that all volunteers and those attending a SOMA mission will need to undertake whatever training requirements are stipulated by the Diocese of Bendigo. There will be more details about these new arrangements when they have been finalised.



In the first two weeks of June, a team from 13+ nations arrived in the Northern Ireland Diocese of Down and Dromore to bless 30 parishes through receiving evangelistic and parish renewal teams for a range of activities from prayer walking to door-to-door mission. Teams were made up of all ages from 19-80s and it has been a huge joy to see God at work in rural areas, housing estates, market towns and Belfast City itself. Members from our Australian SOMA team participated in the mission. Let's hear what impact this mission had on their lives. We've only included the first paragraph of their report. ## Rev Melinda | Rector from Southlakes Anglican, Newcastle, NSW |

I was allocated to visit three parishes over the two and half week period: Rathfriland, Kilkeel and Seagoe. In each parish we were so encouraged by the sense of passion towards mission and evangelism and an openness to stepping into new places in the Spirit. We organised a spiritual gifts exploration evening in one, offered prayer ministry and door-to-door evangelism in another. Each parish were overjoyed to welcome the team, with members from the United Kingdom, United States, India, Ireland, Kenya and Nigeria. I was so inspired to see the

Anglican Communion working at its best, ministering side-by-side so as to bring blessing and encouragement to the parishes in Northern Ireland. Read more >>

#### Rev Peter Malone | Rector, Charnwood Anglican Parish, VIC |

I visited two parishes in Newry and Bangor. One story really touched me. While at Newry, sitting outside St Mary's church with a sign: "Are you in need of prayer?" I sat for 2 hours greeting people as they came along but with no-one taking up the offer. Just as I was about to pack up, a woman walked by and cautiously looked at the sign. She began to walk on but turned back and looked at me. I asked if she would like prayer and she said: Yes. The story she told before I prayed for her revealed she was in a very difficult place and had been walking the streets desperately asking God for help. Such a privilege that he used me from 17,000km away, to show His love and support for His daughter.

Rev Graeme and Susan Liersch | Rector, Parish of Wanthaggi/Inverloch, VIC | Susan and I were released to minister in Kilmood, an evangelical parish who was new to the operation of the Holy Spirit, although opportunities to share did open. Susan was able to offer prayer ministry to some of the mums, and we did some door-to-door visiting which blossomed into many interesting conversations. We then visited Donaghcloney/Waringstown parish and worked to inspire further interest in the moving of the Spirit, and the need for the Spiritual gifts today. We then moved onto Newtownsards and enjoyed a shared meal, communion and prayer, visiting the men's shed and finally finished with the team closing at the sign of St Patrick's first church in Ireland. Finally, at the Diocesan Synod we had opportunity to raise the awareness of SOMA amongst the clergy.
